MOTORCYCLE PROJECT — KENYA

In January 2015, through the generous donation of an anonymous donor, the Motorcycle Project was launched with hopes that it would change the lives of five young men and give them the means to make a living.

Five motorcycles were purchased — three in Isiolo and two in Marsabit. A committee drawn from HOH's partner churches took responsibility to oversee the project.

In Kenya, the *bodaboda* business is one where motorcycles are used to transport people or goods. It is an excellent



way to make a good income and earn a living. Committee members from the churches in Isiolo and Marsabit identified five young men to be recipients of five motorcycles. A contract between the church and the recipient was written with clear-cut expectations and a repayment schedule, so that the motorcycle would be paid for within one year. Once all payments were made, ownership would transfer from the church to the recipient.

January 2016 marked the one-year anniversary of the Motorcycle Project. We are pleased to report that all five motorcycles have been paid for in full! The recipients continue to successfully run their *bodaboda* businesses and the economic status of each man has greatly improved. Additional motorcycles have been purchased with the funds collected by the church, resulting in the opportunity for additional young men to make a living and change the course of their lives, as they look to a brighter future.

Hand of Hope is pleased with the success of this program and looks forward to another successful year.



Galgalo Qalicha, age 29, was one of the first recipients of a motorcycle in Isiolo. Two months into the program, Galgalo was able to get married and have a steady income to support his marriage. He made timely payments on the motorcycle and now owns it himself! His *bodaboda* business continues to be a success. He faithfully supports his church by serving in the church and tithing regularly.

HOH reaches out to many orphans throughout our ministry area. Many of these children have been orphaned as a direct result of HIV/AIDS. HOH provides the opportunity for these children to obtain an education as well as have their basic needs met.

Guidelines have been set up to ensure that the selection process is fair and that we choose the children whom we can help the most. All HOH children are required to attend school regularly. Each child's case is renewed on a yearly basis once their case has been re-evaluated. Bake Chenfo, a dedicated volunteer in Mega, serves as coordinator of the Children's Program in Ethiopia and follows up

regularly with all of these children. Hassan Bagaja and his wife, Hawo, faithfully volunteer their services to coordinate the Children's Program in Kenya.

SUPPORTING THE VILLAGE CHURCH

HOH continues to partner with local churches in Ethiopia and Kenya to support evangelism in rural villages.

God continues to draw people to Himself, and believers in remote village continue to come together to worship.

The church in Deeda Jaarsa is one of the first churches that HOH helped fund the building, many years ago. Recently, HOH provided funds to help them make some much-

needed repairs to the building due to normal use.

In 2013, HOH provided funds to erect a simple church building for the growing congregation in Gaayo, a small village outside of Mega. Funds were recently provided by HOH to help make repairs to the floor and walls of the church. Churches in remote villages, such as Gaayo, are constructed out of mud walls and floors. Repairs are frequently necessary due to nor-

mal use and weather conditions. HOH is happy to be able to help churches such as Gaayo provide a place of worship for believers in the area.

HOH is hoping to help build a church in Soda. Soda is a difficult place to share the Gospel; however, the church in Soda is growing! A larger church building is needed to replace the existing building which is not only too small, but also old and in desperate need of repair.

In Marsabit, Phil and Adam joined other guest speakers and used their gifts of teaching to share with believers in a conference hosted by the local church. Over 600 people attended the conference, and more than 25 Muslims accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior!

Adam also spent some time ministering to the children as he shared God's love for them through His word .

Over the course of the two weeks, Phil and Adam were also able to spend some time with several of the HOH sponsored children in the area and deliver some backpacks and school supplies that had been donated.
